## 2015/2016 FINANCIALS



Haiti Partners is committed to the highest standards of accountability. Because we were in the process of our annual audit at the time of press, the 2015-16 numbers reported here are based on a preliminary draft of our audited financials, and may be subject to change. Our total net assets (school buildings, vehicles, computers, equipment, etc) at year-end were \$1,113,389, including \$107,727 cash on hand. ### **SCHOOLS** PROGRAM

### DURING The **past year**:

The Children's Academy and Learning Center had **154 students, with 4 classes** from age 3 to 1st grade. Children's Academy **teachers continue to receive excellent training.** Students are discovering and developing leadership in learning centers.

Parents volunteered 39,210 service hours doing permaculture gardening on the school grounds, helping in our hand paper-making social business, among other things. This represents a rare and revolutionary approach to education in Haiti.

#### Three middle school grades have been added, meaning our **6 partner schools now** educate 1,055 students.

Four savings & credit groups were established to help people work together and learn about financial management. Groups have 20 to 30 members, meet weekly, and consist of parents, staff, and community members. So far these groups have collected over \$7,000. Participation at meetings is strong, enthusiasm is high, and loan repayment is 98%. At our 5th annual Teacher Summit, 46 teachers from our schools were trained by 13 dedicated

in Holland, Michigan. The training focused on lesson planning and involved many fun and effective student-centered teaching techniques. ### CHURCHES PROGRAM

### DURING The **past year**:

#### Our second class of 8 Micah Scholars graduated, making up over 10% of the graduates from our 3 partner seminaries.

They'll serve as pastors and community leaders across Haiti. This class included 2 women, Christevienne and Frodelyne. Congratulations to these pioneers!



We published 2 new Bible study resources—on women's rights and leadership within the church, and on creation care for urban churches. Over 8,000 copies of these and our 5 other Bible study guides were distributed. We led 3 campaigns for children's rights, women's rights, and creation care. This mobilized 600 pastors and leaders in 30 different churches, and over 4,000 people participated in the 3 rallies capping off these campaigns. **Four Micah Scholars visited** Washington, DC, and Richmond, Virginia, for a 10-day exchange trip. They learned, sang songs, shared their testimonies, visited

historical sites, and exchanged ideas



with various ministries. It was a profound trip for both the Haitians and Americans involved. Micah Scholar graduates began teaching classes at 2 of our partner seminaries, so **100 first-year students are learning our methods and resources.**  Above: Estè leans into her discussion group at a Micah Scholars retreat last year.
