Dear Friends - This past year tested Haiti beyond measure. An estimated 1.4 million people—half of them children—have been displaced, and more than 1,000 schools have closed their doors, many taken over by armed gangs. Yet, despite these dark times, **Haiti Partners schools remain open, standing strong as beacons of hope and resilience, serving more than 1700 students each school day.**

Our flagship school, **The Children's Academy**, continues to provide quality education to over 500 students. Against all odds, our dedicated team has continued teaching, nurturing, and protecting children who deserve stability and a brighter future. As a result, **for the 2nd year in a row, 100% of our 9th graders passed the National Exams, an extraordinary accomplishment anywhere in Haiti today.**

Now's the time to lean in more than ever. The impact is profound. Life in Haiti is growing harder—

safety isn't guaranteed, and electricity, gas, and healthcare are increasingly scarce—yet our teachers remain steadfast, educating and caring for every child who walks through our doors. Because each student carries the hope of a nation on their shoulders, we cannot, and must not, stop now.

SCHOOLS PROGRAM

503 pre-K through 10th-grade students benefitted from an inspiring, student-

centered, changemaker education at The Children's Academy as the school launched its 10th grade, Haiti's first year of high school. **Cooperating together in konbit**, students, parents, teachers and community members worked throughout the year **planting hundreds of trees** in the school community, **organizing community meetings** to discuss school safety and other vital issues, and **doing wellness visits for over 300 students**. Additionally, for the 2nd year running, **100% of Children's Academy 9th graders passed Haiti's National Exam**. This is an extraordinary achievement in Haiti where a typical passing rate is around 70%.

119,743 service hours were provided by parents and secondary students at The Children's Academy. Parents engage at the school doing a variety of important tasks through service hours: working the permaculture gardens, tending school grounds, helping in the social businesses, assisting teachers, serving as community health agents, and more.

45 parents graduated from Community Change Groups in July. Community Change Groups strengthen families and protect the vulnerable through ongoing training for parents in Child Protection and Gender Equality. Parents learn the skills they need to be more loving to their kids and each other. This year's module focused on the protection of children through positive discipline and "love in action."



For the 2nd year in a row, 100% of Children's Academy 9th graders passed the National Exam. In a country where the average passing rate is about 70%, this is a truly extraordinary achievement.

276 students received technology education twice a week at The Children's Academy, representing all students 3rd grade and up. Students work in the on-site computer lab and learn both the basics for how to operate a computer, but also how to do things like digital art, and English, French and Spanish language learning.

1198 students at our six Partner Schools received student-centered education thanks to training and support made possible through your partnership. In addition to learning Haiti's National Curriculum - which includes traditional subjects like math, science, and history - Partner Schools also engaged students in arts education (including learning to play instruments), gardening, creative writing, meal programs, Village Savings and Loan groups, and more.

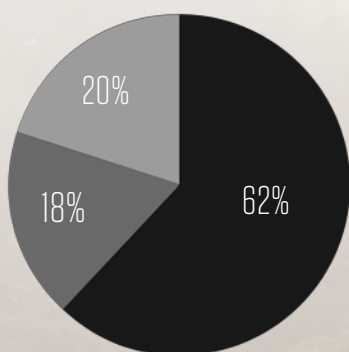

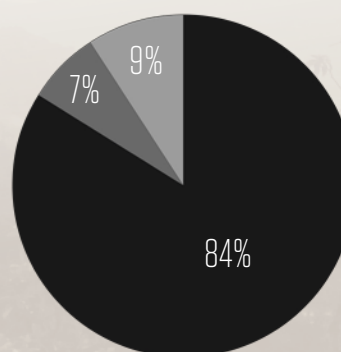


FINANCIAL REPORT

Haiti Partners is committed to the highest standards of accountability. Total net assets (cash, deposits, school buildings, vehicles, computers, equipment, etc) at fiscal year end were \$1,205,947. Fortunately, we had enough reserves to cover this deficit and we carry no debt. Earnings Before Depreciation was (\$255,805). Thanks to Circle Fund donors, Admin and Fundraising expenses were covered allowing 100% of gifts from all others to go directly to programs.
